ACTIVITIES DURING COVID AND RECENT FLOODS

As with this time last year our activities have been rather disrupted in India because of Covid although we're pleased to confirm that, our work has continued although at a slower pace.

Our primary activity has always been the sponsorship of poor children/families and this has continued through the pandemic. Although it has been more difficult for the funds to be distributed to the families Jacob has worked with them to ensure sponsors support continues to get through to where it's needed. Some families have experienced additional

problems with the recent flooding in Kerala which was briefly mentioned on the

BBC news in the UK earlier this month.



Jacob managed to distribute about 50 packs of provisions costing about £7 per kit to affected people in the flooded area with the help of the elected representative (local govt official)



Schools here reopened on Nov 1st and we managed to give out some books & umbrellas to a

school. The school is the local lower primary school in Chengannur. They only have 30 students as only the poorest families send their children here. The parents are mostly labourers. The man in white is the local elected representative through whom we made the distribution. We also provided similar items to a local disabled school.

SUCCESS THROUGH SPONSORSHIP

Nearly 250 families have been helped through our sponsorships over the years. Although our sponsorships were envisaged to last while the children were at school many sponsors have continued beyond then as the



children turn into adults and make their way in life. Each has received enormous benefits through the money donated and Jacob has recently sent details of how two such families have achieved a successful way out of poverty.....

"Sunil and Sulekha lost both their parents when they were little children and were brought up by their grandmother who is still alive but old and weak. They were sponsored until 2008. Sulekha, now a lab technician, got married to Rajeev earlier and they now have a baby. They live in Kerala.

Sunil is an automobile salesman in Muscat in the Gulf and got married to Anju a nurse in August, 2021. We were



invited to the wedding and gave them a small gift too. We managed to build them a small house in 1997 at a cost of Rs. 48000/- (around £500 then) and that was our 12th house. Photos are of Sunil and Sulekha taken for their case history way back in 1996 and Sunil on his wedding day. The children worked hard with financial help from their sponsor and we are happy to see them now in this position and they remain grateful for our support in their most needy days. Pictures like this make you all the more happy especially when you see children climb up the ladder of life."

"Amal and Aswathy also lost both their parents early in life and were brought up by

their grandparents Sivasankar and Ponamma who were clay pot makers. They were sponsored from 2006 to 2015. **Ashwathy** studied hard in Bangalore to become a nurse. She was smart enough to write another test and is now a Nurse in the UK in the Peterborough City Care Centre under the NHS! **Amal** finished his hotel management studies in Bangalore and works in the hotel industry and hopes to go abroad soon.
