

SEWING MACHINES ARE STILL IN DEMAND


One of our very earliest projects was to provide sewing machines to enable recipients to earn a small income to help support themselves and their families. We are still active in this way. We managed to give an electric machine to a lady named Jayanthi who knew tailoring but did not have enough money to buy a sewing machine of her own.

Her husband is sick and not able to work so she works as a cleaner at a local car showroom but it's hard work with long hours. She also goes to a tailoring shop to do some piece work but with this machine from us she can sit at home and earn a little more in her spare time (beside cooking and cleaning at home!).


As she has arthritis a manual machine would have been difficult to pedal so it is perfect for her. She bought it from a friend who was not using it and so ended up paying only about £70. She was delighted with it as it will make her life just a little bit easier.

When several of her friends and well wishers saw what we had done they followed suit and helped her



HUNGRY FUND FOOD DISTRIBUTIONS



We managed to give out 25 kits of provisions during the Onam week. Many of the recipients were old and bed ridden and so we hired an Autorickshaw and had them delivered rather than asking them to come and pick up from us. Jacob reports "We don't have to really say how happy and grateful they were to receive these kits which consisted of 22 items mainly Oil, curry powders, toiletries and daily usable items. The government usually gives out such kits during Onam but they never include this many items. Also, because government funds were tight, only the very weakest in the community were receiving help this time.








SPONSORSHIP HELPS EDUCATIONAL PROGRESS
